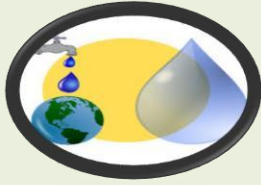

World Water Day

As per the World Water Report by UNESCO, the usage of water has been increased by 1 % per year over the last 40 years. It has been estimated that the water scarcity faced by urban population will grow from 933 million to 1.7 – 2.4 billion people in 2050.

Over the decades, it has been observed that water – energy – food – ecosystem is a powerful approach to address the water problems. Over 2 billion people worldwide are unable to access safe drinking water even in the 2020s and more than half of the World's population is experiencing severe water crisis all through the year. These problems are going to increase by time. However, less than 1 % part of the water is fresh and usable for drinking but due to climatic changes that are taking place are affecting this water resource as per the SDG Report 2022.

In order to address these issues to the students, S. Pavani, Lecturer in Physics, has prepared an online quiz to inform the students about the severity of the situation. The effect of this issue is more in drought-prone areas like Ananthapur, Sri Sathya Sai District of Andhra Pradesh.

As per UNICEF's report, 1 in 4 children live in extreme drought conditions by 2040. Chennai is the first Indian city to use recycled waste water. A total of 125 students have participated in the quiz from various colleges in Andhra Pradesh.

The Department of Telugu, has organized celebrating International Mother Language Day in the Virtual Class room for the students of the College. The objective is to celebrate languages and multilingualism that are powerful tools in socio cultural inclusion in the diverse society.

The theme of this year's day is "multilingual education – a necessity to transform education"

Dr. S. Shamiulla Sir spoke about the history of this day – In 1952, the students studying in the University of Dhaka launched a nation wide protest against the imposition of Urdu which was then called East Pakistan. This linguistic moment led to the formation of Bangladesh in 1971. It is also said that among 7000 languages in the world 2000 are spoken in India. Out of which 22 languages are recognized by the Constitution of India, 99 are non scheduled languages.

National Achievement Survey carried out in 2012 has clearly showed significant impact on the performance of the student in mathematics and reading comprehension whose medium of instruction is same as that spoke at home for the students of age between 5 and 12. As a part of NEP implementation ministry of education has taken up initiative imparting technical education in mother tongue. All the textbooks are planned to prepare both in English and local languages. In the first phase the work is started to introduce mother tongue as the medium of instruction till fifth grade. Further expanding it to all graduation levels including technical education in over two years.

The police will rush to the spot with GPS equipped vehicle and assist the person who had called them. The application also has features supporting audio and video recording which would be substantial evidence of the incident. M.S. Charan Sai, I.B.A., student spoke about the human trafficking and the plight of the women of all genders once she is kidnapped and are sent to warehouses who not only sexually abused but also exploited in the name of house keepers, daily labourers and beggars.
