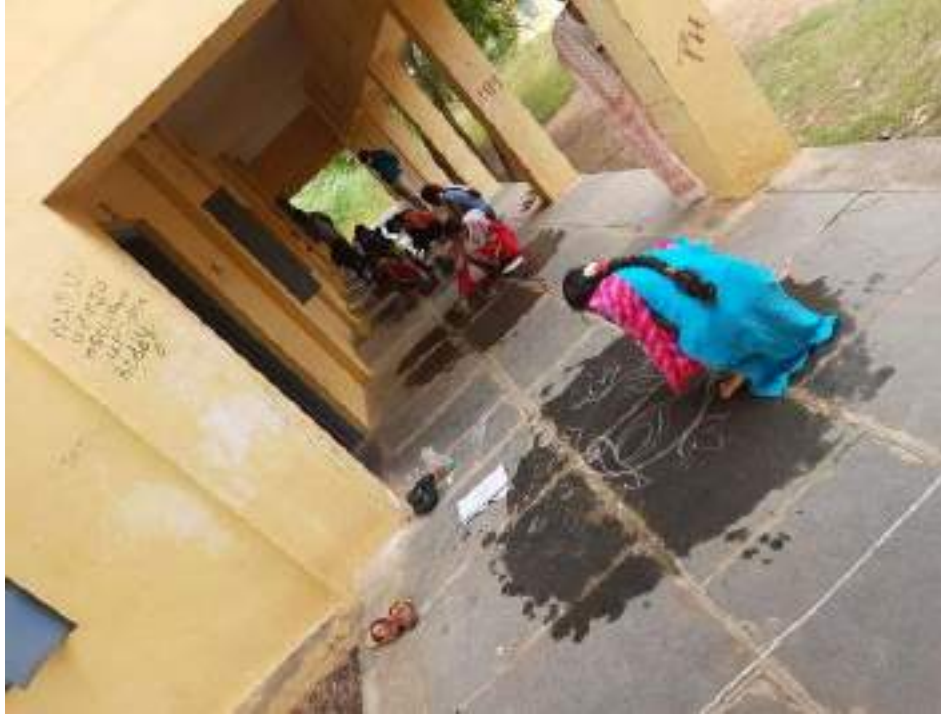

The Department of Physics organized a Field visit to Satish Dhawan Space Research Centre at Sriharikota with a view to showing the students the launch of SSLV-D1, a small satellite that carries two satellites namely EOS-02 and AzaadiSAT. It is the first of its kind launched in India.

“ India will want to hang down head in shame if even one person is left who is said in any way to be untouchable” is one of his famous inspirational quotes.

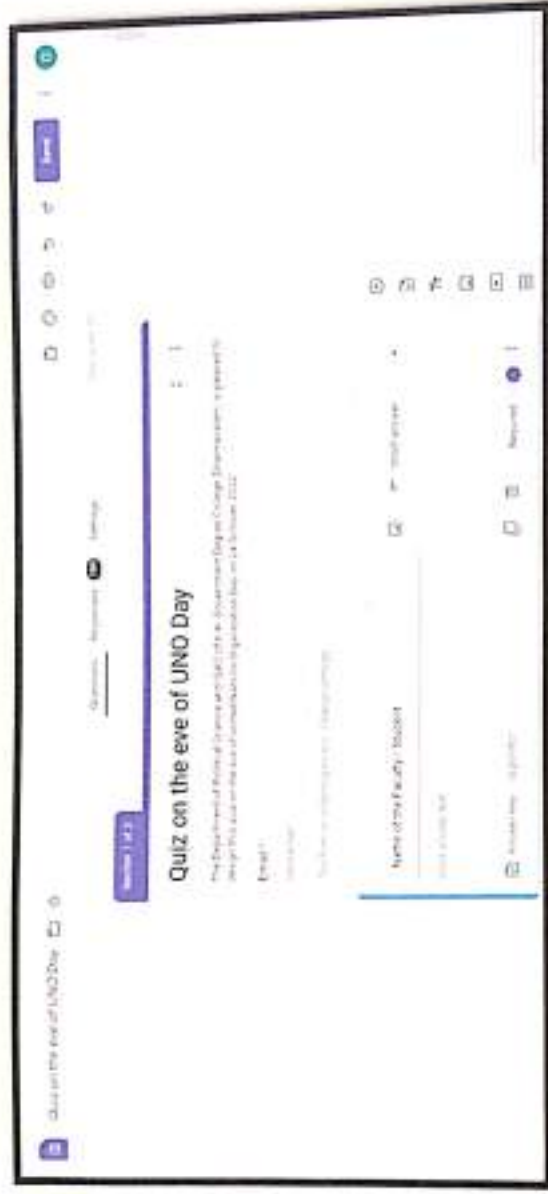

Prabhakar Reddy, Principal of the College paid tribute to the great personality by garlanding his portrait and praised the tiresome journey of Babasaheb Ambedhkar who strived for establishing secularism and equality among the people of India who are divided in the name of religion and caste. He was also a great economist who had a vision of the country 50 years ahead and proposed various measures in upbringing the economic status of the Country after independence.

He also believed that Democracy is not merely a form of government but it is a primary mode of associate living of conjoint communicated experience. It is essentially an attitude of respect and reverence towards fellowmen. He was the first Indian to pursue Doctorate. He learnt 9 languages and studied across the world for 21 years. His is the only statue placed in the London Museum along side of the statue of Karl Marx even today.

Out of which 22 languages are recognized by the Constituion of India, 99 are non scheduled languages.

National Achievement Survey carried out in 2012 has clearly showed significant impact on the performance of the student in mathematics and reading comprehension whose medium of instruction is same as that spoke at home for the students of age between 5 and 12.
